Former

Ross mountain bike coordinator and race promoter John
Kirkpatrick has moved on to his own independent advertising agency and says he isn't handling any bike-related promotions at the moment....
It didn't take long for New
York City to go through the evolutionary mountain bike process. After mountain bikers "discovered" Central Park (how hard is that?), the number of fat-tire cyclists grew ex-

plosively until, Wham! Signs and fines. Most of the dirt paths used by the mountain bikers are now off-limits....I recently mentioned the Paris-Dakar Mountain Bike Rally as being what sounded like the toughest off-road race yet. No chance. It turns out (according to Jacquie Phelan's translation) to have been more of a tour than a race, with total participation of about a half dozen.... In response to the

obvious need for local groups of mountain bikers to organize a political arm, Bay Area off-roaders have done so. The Bicycle Trails Council has chapters in several of the more hard-core cycling areas, such as Marin County and the East Bay, and is affiliated with the Responsible Off-Road Moun-

tain Pedalers (ROMP) of the South San Francisco Bay area Former national champion Joe Murray has moved again. After riding the last part of '86 and all of '87 for Marin Bikes. Joe has switched to The Bicycle Group, sponsored by several dozen companies that collectively make everything you need to ride off-road: sunglasses, liniment, vitamins, energy food, and so on. Bikes? Oh ves, bikes. The Bicycle Group is also the new marketing arm for the Merlin Metalworks titanium bike, formerly marketed by Marin, and there are plans for an imported line. Although a press release claims that Joe is the winningest mountain bike racer in history, with 60 victories, perhaps we should point out that Joe is the winningest male rider. If he wins another 30 races he'll catch up to Alice B. Toeclips In other race news. Schwinn has joined with Wheaties to sponsor a team that no longer will have the services of two-time

nat champ Ned Overend, who has joined the powerful Special**ized** team along with women's champs Lisa Muhich and Cindy Whitehead. Team veteran John Weissenrieder will stay on with Schwinn/ Wheaties, joined by Julia Ingersoll and converted roadie Tim **Rutherford...** Because the Ross team has disbanded, the key riders have all found new sponsors. Casey Kunselman is the new star of Diamond Back. Joe Sloup has gone to Raleigh, and Mike Jordan has signed with Klein Charlie Cunningham's aluminum bikes are legendary for a number of reasons, not the least of which is their scarcity. Scare City. This situation is not likely to improve in the near future either. because Charlie has announced that he's going to sit this year out and observe the scene. Next bike production is scheduled for '89, and he's not even taking orders until then. ... After a recent three-day meeting in Northern Califor-

nia, representatives from a number of mountain bike clubs announced the formation of the International Mountain **Bicycling Association (IMBA).** Plans call for an international membership drawn from riders, manufacturers and clubs. which will work together on issues that concern all-terrain cyclists, such as access, political organization, education, and liaison with other recreational groups. Competition was specifically omitted as a subject for discussion because it's the principal area of the National Off-Road Bicycle Association (NORBA). Clubs represented included ROMP, Bicycle Trails **Council** chapters from North Bay and East Bay, The Rough Riders of Sacramento, and the **Concerned Off-Road Bicyclists Association** (CORBA) from Los Angeles. Evidently, local riders have decided to let the world in on their great biking.
